OSJ President's Message 2016

This has been a year of change, with our new Executive members settling in to start on the usual activities of the Ophthalmological Society of Jamaica (OSJ). Since its rejuvenation in 2011, the OSJ continues to strive to improve our commitment to quality eye care and the development of the Ophthalmology profession in Jamaica.

Our greatly anticipated 6th Annual Conference of the OSJ will be one to remember as it is where technology and latest updates convene. "State of the Art" and "cutting edge" are some terms that have been used to describe the newly acquired resources in our Hospital Eye Clinics this year. This conference will continue this new found transformation.

Our 2016 programme will as usual be an exciting and informative one as we learn more on corneal cross linking, VisAbility Implants, revisit Trabeculectomies, delve into the wonderful world of Retina with micro incisional vitrectomies (MIVS, suture less vitrectomies) and micro pulse laser. We are pleased that Dr Lileth Wu will be sharing with us the latest on Diabetic Macula oedema management.

Our ORBIS sponsored guest speaker this year will be Dr Susan McDonald, who is the director for the Resident's Phacoemulsification Course in the USA. She will share with us the management of complex cataracts and complications, a lecture not to be missed.

The OSJ aims to promote excellence not only in Eye care in Jamaica but also in professional development and ethical practice in Ophthalmology. In keeping with our mandate we have included a special segment this year in which we will discuss ethical principles associated with our practice and hear from 2 guest speakers; Dr Susan Mc Donald and Mrs. Arlene Harrison Henry, Jamaica's Public Defender.

The past year (2015-2016) has seen the OSJ continuing its mandate of providing professional education to our fellow physicians and patients. In recognition of World Sight Day in October 2015 we held our usual Medical Physicians Ophthalmic conference on" Drugs and the Eye" at the Courtleigh. This heavily oversubscribed meeting was beyond our expectation as there was no standing room available in the auditorium during that meeting. It is indeed a great pleasure to see the interest of other health personnel in Ophthalmology. Everyone concurred that it was an extremely stimulating, riveting and informative meeting.

Our Public symposium, which is always free to the public was held October 11th 2015 at the Main Medical Lecture theatre was also a great success. This was videotaped by Cable News and Sports (CNS News) and showed several times over the following months on that TV channel. We also had our usual articles written by our members in a Gleaner World Sight Day supplement. These articles are available on our website (www.ophthalsj.com) and updated news can be found on our Facebook page.

We continue to fulfil our aims of collaboration with other Ophthalmology Societies as we have now signed an agreement with the American Academy of Ophthalmologists to include an OSJ news segment in their Academy Express eNewsletter.

The OSJ calls for action from the Ministry of Health for the improvement of access to and quality of eye care services that are an integral part of a national health system. As 80% of the visual impairment is avoidable, we must work towards the global plan, developed in 2013 by the World Health Assembly. The Global Action Plan (GAP) for the Prevention of Avoidable Blindness and Visual Impairment 2014-2019, aims for Universal Eye Health, to reduce avoidable blindness and visual impairment worldwide by 25% by 2019. So engaging with the Ministry of Health, we hope to improve public private partnership to deliver

Preventative and screening actions are essential in reaching our goal. We are pleased to see the development of Diabetic Retinopathy screening clinics at the University Hospital of the West Indies and the start of the National Diabetic Retinopathy Screening Clinics, initially in Mandeville to be rolled out island wide within the next 2 years, with funding from the Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee Trust fund

This year we welcome 2 new Platinum sponsors, Bayer and Aristopharma, amongst the many sponsors (new and returning) who have always supported us through the years. I would like to thank the hardworking executive who worked tirelessly and to make our 2016 conference a reality.


